New bakery opens at Eagle Market – with lost of treats!

SPONDON Bakery has a few treats in store at its new outlet in Derby city centre.

It has expanded its operations and opened a stall in the Eagle Market.

The firm has been based in Moor Street since 2012 but after a successful first six years, the owners have decided to grow.

The Spondon Bakery stall, which opened on Thursday, is near the Intu entrance of the market next to the Card Party store.

And it contains all the goodies you would expect – bread, sausage rolls, pork pies, cakes, cookies, brownies, lemon drizzle and chocolate flapjacks. It even has its own Sunday dinner roll.

The business is owned by Vagelis Grakalis who moved to Derby from Greece in 1999 with his family. The businessman is also on the lookout for bakers and has urged anyone

interested to apply. Mr Grakalis, 46, said: “We’ve had a great response so far from the public, which has been great.

“We started several years ago and decided we want to expand and build our name. We want to be here on a permanent basis. We are recruiting bakers, which are hard to find, so it would be great to hear from anyone who is interested.”

All the food is made in its Spondon branch. The bakery has appeared on the TV screens appearing on Britain’s Best Bakery, which aired on ITV several years ago.

Spondon Bakery’s move to the Eagle Market comes at what new owners Intu say is an “exciting journey of transformation” for the

market.

Intu purchased the Eagle Market in March last year from Derby City Council.

WMC Retail Partners, also known as Town and Country Markets, vowed to write a “new chapter” for the centre, having been appointed by Intu.
